Okay. We're good. Oh, wow.

Not to be confused with Nicki Minaj. We were like, I wasn't into it. Oh, my God.

She's over. She lost a million followers. 10 million people? No, 10 million or something.

I know she lost a whole bunch. Yes, 10 million is what I read. I read this last night because she appeared.

Well, let's not even say what she did. But the problem is the way she connects with her audience is really on her Instagram more than anything. So by killing that account, they're saying she's killing her career.

What's new with me? Well, I went to the dentist. I had to go to a new dentist. This is one thing I don't like about insurance.

When your insurance changes. And mine does because I have to be flexible in my career. Very averse in my career.

I got a new dentist. Flex. He's like 80 years old.

So I'm like, I better trust this guy. Either you trust an 80-year-old dentist or you don't. Right? Like either they've seen every tooth and they can do it.

So I also don't take Novocaine or anything. I don't numb my mouth. I'm one of those guys that just goes in.

And I gave him a deadline. He said he could do it in 20 minutes. And he did.

He did a filling. Little one. In 20 minutes.

But he taught me. He says when it comes to brushing teeth, Mark. Yeah, I know.

It's very twisted. Here's even more twisted. Five minutes twice a day to brush your teeth.

You're supposed to brush your teeth for five minutes. I'm up to two and a half minutes. But I can't quite make that five-minute line.

Have you ever brushed your teeth that long? I have to have some kind of way to let you know that I'm going to do a sound effect. Because it'd be nice to get them in there properly. But we're working.

Everybody knows that we're just going video. Just now. Like in the last few weeks.

Oh, I'm trying to guess. Is this the signal? Or is this the signal? Or what's the signal? Oh, I can do it. Well, I can't do it.

I can do this. Yeah. Okay.

That works. And then if you... Oh, see. That worked.

The timing was good. Or maybe this. Wait.

There's one more. We've got to try. See if this one works.

Hang on. Oh, my God. I lost you.

I lost the thing. Hang on a second. Here's one for... Let's see if this one works.

You weren't looking. You want me to do it again? Yes, I was looking. Okay.

We're taking too much of the show over that shit. Oopsie. So, yes.

Five minutes of brushing. He gave me a special brush while I had to purchase it. Oral B that actually does a green light.

And when the green light is going, you know you're on target. If it's red, you're pushing it too hard. If it's green, not hard enough.

Oh, that's really advanced. Yellow, not hard enough. Really fancy.

And then it'll beep at five minutes. But I only can get up to two and a half minutes. It's just too hard for me.

Too hard. Frank is extremely good about his dental hygiene. And so, like, he never has... He gets a cleaning every four months.

And I'm the opposite. I, like, don't like going to the dentist. So, I put it off and put it off and put it off.

Fortunately, I don't have that many teeth left. Most of mine are not real. But still, like... Yeah, I still got to go in in the new year and have it done.

I always dread it because I know the pockets are deep. And I know they're going to tell me I need to see a periodontist. And I know I'm not going to.

Yeah, they like to floss shame at the dentist. You know, if you're not flossing, you're flossing. You know? I did say one time not long ago, I don't like being lectured.

Like, please don't lecture me. My doctor doesn't lecture me. My physical doctor doesn't lecture me.

No, mine was like, because he's an 80-year-old man. He gave me, like, a little class in dental care. And at 80, he can lecture you.

I'm not talking back to an 80-year-old man. No, I didn't mind. And I told his assistants, who were like 20, that they're lucky to have him because he was smart.

You know, I think they appreciate him. Nice little field there. The other thing I decided, you know, like, when I go to the gym, I decided I can't just go to do this.

You know what I do when I'm on a long trip? I listen to it. I don't normally listen to the show because I'm like, I'm listening to it while we're working. Although sometimes you accuse me of not listening.

She goes, wow, that looks just like my vase. You know, that was funny, you know? This year what they did is they're sending their parents holiday cards and they're signing them from people who they don't even know, like Jim and Kate or Nancy and Drew. And the mom's going, what? I don't, who is that? And I had that happen.

I got a card the other day that it wasn't a joke, but I really don't know. I couldn't remember who the people were. Then I remembered.

But what's even more, we can save this for the big moment in the show, you know, things that drive us nuts, but when you get one of those photo cards and there's no printing on it or hand signature or anything. It's just the card with the title. Merry Christmas.

I went a little more personal. Also, today is the last day of Kwanzaa. Kwanzaa is really celebrated over two days, the 25th and 26th.

I really never knew what Kwanzaa was. You know, for a while when they said, you know, when they put it on the permanent Outlook, they're like, we should acknowledge Kwanzaa. Kwanzaa is really different.

And actually it goes through, I think, the 31st. There's different elements of it that include one day of doing handmade gifts. There's a unity cup involved.

There's a large communal feast that's held called the Karumu, which is a feast on December 31st. There's a part of it you'll love that's including creative expression. They involve African drumming, storytelling, poetry readings, a lot of colors.

Chinese New Year, which I am aware of because I'm a dog in Chinese years. Also known as the Lunar New Year, falls between the 21st of January and February 20th, depending on the year. The Islamic New Year, or Hijrit New Year, is based on the lunar calendar and varies each year.

In countries like Spain and Latin America, it's customary to eat 12 grapes at midnight, one for each chime of the clock. Now, I saw that on Modern Family. Oh! That's cool.

I've got it coming together. Remember last week when I told you how I sneeze and that means my stomach isn't well? So it wasn't a cough. It was a sneeze.

My stomach's catching up. So I'm a little nauseous right now. This is live.

I fly through Dallas a lot. I also spend a lot of time in Dallas. Probably out of those twenty cities, my least favorite of those cities.

Not a fan. Not a fan. I will go to Florida because I have Susie, you know, and my uncle lives down in Naples, we've got Boston, we've got Charlie in Boston.

Yeah, we have a lot of viewers in those twenty cities, you know that. We do, we've got followers everywhere. We do, we do.
